8. Meeting MP and reply re Clean Air Day

- It was thought an advantage to maintain contact with Emma Reynolds so that she is made aware of how local HW concerns feed into national concerns in parliament.

9. Bucks Council and glyphosate - follow up?

 Bucks Council's use of glyphosate: reply from Simon Coultas, Operations Manager parks and Green Spaces (mostly around High Wycombe) (thanks, Liz):
 The short answer would be no we have not used Glyphosate since I have been in post We make use of mechanical methods like strimming, scrapping, and edging up, but weed growth is not a huge problem in Parks. I think you will find it more relevant to Highways and Street Scene operations.

We also make use of mulch combined with weed matting cover to suppress weed growth in planted areas.

- A member is awaiting replies from Streets and Highways
- A member wrote to Red Kite they do use glyphosate on pavement edges. Members thought this a danger to waterways through run off and danger to residents who live nearby. Nevertheless, physical methods to clear 'weeds' where necessary is time consuming and potentially expensive but Marlow doesn't use glyphosate on their pavements and edges.
- A member will write to Marlow Town Council and Wild Marlow to find out how they clear Marlow's pavement weeds etc. without using glyphosate with a view to suggestions to Bucks Council.
