- Use of glyphosate in GB is authorised until December 2026 when another decision will be made.
- A member will contact the National Trust to find out more about their use of weed killers.
- A member will try to find out more about pros and cons of non-glyphosate use from Marlow Council to potentially propose to Red Kite.
- A member will investigate the use of vinegar.
